

Formació extracurricular en idiomes

English C1.2

Presentation

This is a semester-long C1.2 level course consisting of 30 on-site hours and 60 hours of online work (5 ECTS) that will help you obtain a C1.2 level of English under the CEFR and enable you to move on to a C1 exam preparatory class and take an official C1 level exam.

Pre-course requirements

A C1.1 level

Objectives

To improve in all skill areas (reading, writing, listening and speaking) at a C1.2 level.

Syllabus

Following the online language-learning platform NetLanguages, students will cover the topics with related vocabulary and grammar from Units 6 to 10 of NetLanguages' Advanced (C1) course.

Students will work on the online activities autonomously following the timetable set by the teacher. In-class activities will focus on speaking and writing based on the topics of the units.

Unit 6 - Net Addiction

Study vocabulary relating to addiction, personality and the verb *to get*.

Study the use of the negative adverbs *hardly*, *seldom*, etc., and the verb patterns of *recommend*, *advise* and *suggest*.

Study expressions for giving advice.

Practise the weak, unstressed vowel sound *schwa*.

Unit 7 - One of My Favourites

Study a group of adverbs which express your attitude and how compound adjectives are formed.

Look at some ways that the present participle and the past participle are used.

Practise the language of talking about music.

Learn how to stress words in sentences.

Unit 8 - Missing

Study vocabulary relating to evidence, ignorance and worry.

Study the use of the indefinite pronouns and different ways of making things negative.

Study ways of apologising and making excuses.

Practise ways of negating statements using sentence stress.

Unit 9 - The Same Argument

Study words related to the theme of arguing, including metaphors for anger.

Study delexical verbs (*have*, *make*, *give*, *take*) and verb patterns, including reciprocal verbs (e.g., "argue with each other").

Study the language of avoiding arguments.

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Study homographs - words that are spelt the same but pronounced differently.

Unit 10 - Chances Are

Study a group of phrasal verbs which all have one word in common.

Study the language of likelihood and probability, nouns used to report clauses, and how to use *do* to add emphasis.

Practise the language for making requests.

Learn how to pronounce acronyms (NASA, the UK, etc.).

Evaluation systems and criteria

Students must pass all of the assessment with a 6 to successfully complete the course. Assessment will include the online end-of-unit quizzes and end-of-term exam, plus the oral and written assessments done in class. In addition, students must attend at least 50% of the on-site sessions and complete 100% of the online exercises.

At the end of the term, a certificate of attendance stating the level achieved will be issued to all students who successfully complete the course
